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materials

Crib: 38" x 38"
Finished Blocks: 6"

Black Solid

1¼ yards for blocks, border and binding

Red Tone-on-Tone

⅝ yard for blocks

Assorted Green Tone-on-Tones

1⅞ yards *total* for blocks and setting patches

Backing

1¼ yards

Batting

42" x 42"

(Although fabric amounts for foundation piecing are adequate, you may need more if you cut very generous patches.)

cutting

Black Solid

for border

2 strips 4½" x 33" for sides

2 strips 4½" x 41" for top/bottom

5 strips 2¼" x 40" for binding

Red Tone-on-Tone

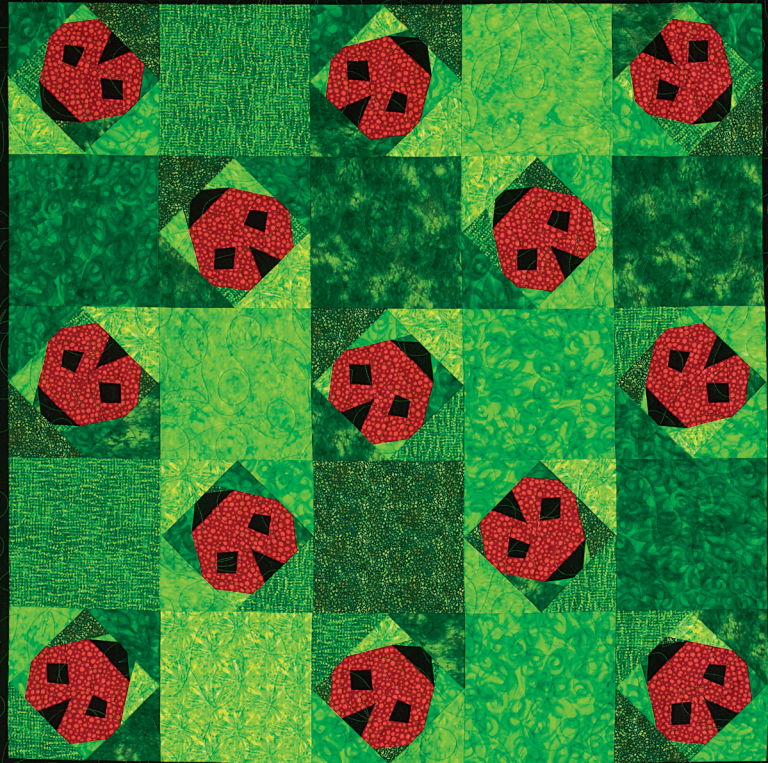

Assorted Green Tone-on-Tones

26 squares 3⅞" x 3⅞" cut diagonally to yield 52 triangles ▽ (A)

12 squares (B) 6½" x 6½"

1 Making the Quilt Top

Make 13 paper copies of each foundation section. Foundation piece each section in numerical order, pressing and trimming after each patch addition.

Sew sections 1–2 and A's together as shown to make a block. Make 13 blocks.

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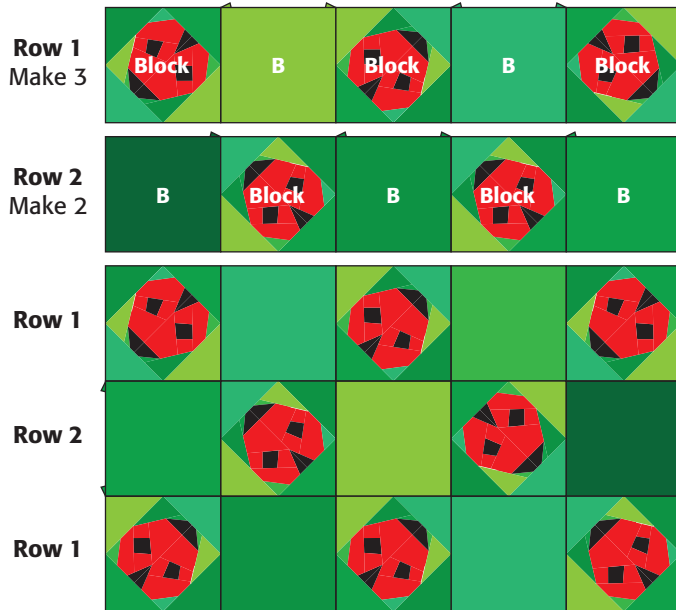
Randomly changing the orientation of the blocks, sew the blocks and B's together as shown to make 3 row 1's and 2 row 2's. Sew the rows together as shown.

Sew the border side strips to the quilt and trim any extra length. Add the border top and bottom strips in the same way.

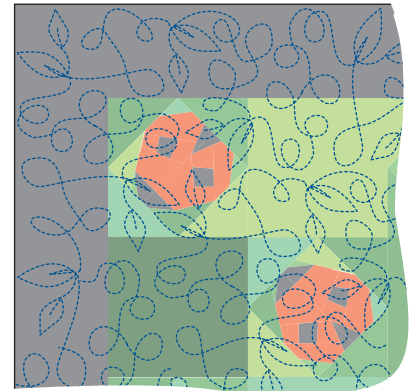
2 Quilting and Finishing

Layer and baste together the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt a loopy meander with random leaves over the quilt surface.

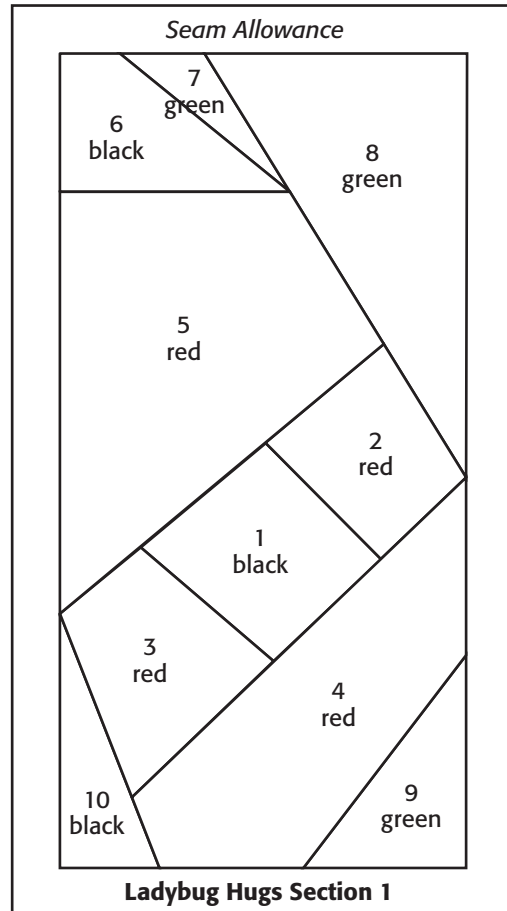
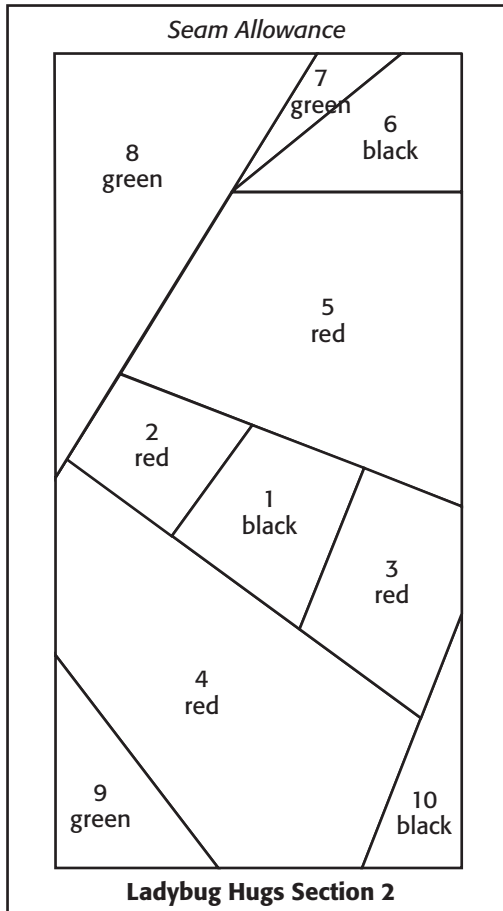
Bind the quilt.
